#### VIRTUAL APPRENTICESHIP SNAPSHOT

During Spring 2021, Stantec Engineering, introduced apprentices to the field of engineering and water management. Stantec assembled materials to construct a water filter. These kits were delivered by AL staff to 5 apprentices. Over Zoom, apprentices learned about the water that comes out of their taps at home and tested its purity. Stantec engineers also shared how they are addressing climate change and flooding in Boston, sharing videos, and inviting students to problem-solve with them.

At the conclusion, Tyrone reflected, "This gave me good work strategies around a career with water. I am also interested in learning about how they build bridges."




## LAUNCH+

Expanded services to alumni with LaunchPlus, a paid job skills internship for current ninth graders who are interested in a summer job.







Our staff delivered 174 boxes of office supplies, professional Zoom-wear, and project kits to the homes of our apprentices.



Pivoted all of our programming to a virtual platform to serve all eighth graders in our partner schools.





#### **WORKPLACE EXPLORATIONS**

One-day virtual workplace business as well as opportunities to meet, practice skills, and learn alongside engaging professionals.



#### **APPRENTICESHIPS**

Six virtual preparatory classes help visit that offers insights to a students identify their strengths and build a toolkit of communication and self-presentation techniques. A virtual apprenticeship of five, 90minute sessions follows when youth work alongside a career mentor at a company where they learn the purpose and culture of a business.



#### **CITY SUMMER INTERNSHIP**

For our rising ninth grade alumni who identify as female, a hybrid, five-week paid career exploration in STEAM and other careers where women are underrepresented.



#### **LAUNCHPLUS INTERNSHIP**

40 hr. paid job skills internship for alumni over 14-weeks to deepen professional skills and get extensive support on completing digital summer job applications that will culminate in every participant completing at least one summer job.


#### **GOALS**

- Engage the business community in nurturing youth of color who are reservoirs of creativity and talent and will contribute to a skilled, diverse, and equitable future workforce.






Net Assets - Beginning of Year
